PERMIT TO OPERATE

PERMITTEE: Northeast Lamp Recycling, Inc.  
FACILITY ADDRESS: 250 Main Street, East Windsor, CT

Pursuant to Section 22a-208a, 22a-209e and 22a-454 of the Connecticut General Statutes ("CGS"), and Section 22a-209-4 of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies ("RCSA"), a PERMIT TO OPERATE IS HEREBY ISSUED by the Commissioner of Environmental Protection ("Commissioner") to Northeast Lamp Recycling, Inc. ("Permittee") to operate a solid waste volume reduction plant ("Facility") located at 250 Main Street in East Windsor, CT. Subsequently, the Permit to Operate No. 0470324 issued on July 16, 1996 IS HEREBY REVOKED.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. As used in this permit, the following definitions shall apply:

"Ballast" means a device that electrically controls light fixtures and that includes a "capacitor" or "PCB capacitor" containing 0.1 kg or less of dielectric fluid.

"Capacitor" means a device for accumulating and holding a charge of electricity and consisting of conducting surfaces separated by a dielectric.

"CFR" means Code of Federal Regulations.

"Commissioner" means the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Protection or the Commissioner's designee.

"Department" or "DEP" means the Department of Environmental Protection.

"Day" means calendar day.


"Hazardous Waste" means any waste material as defined by Section 22a-448 of the CGS which may pose a present or potential hazard to human health or the environment when improperly treated, stored, transported or disposed of, or otherwise managed including hazardous waste identified in accordance with section 3001 of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976 (42 USC 6901 et seq.).

"Lamp" or "Universal Waste Lamp" means a lamp as defined by Section 22a-449(c) 100(c)(18) and for the purpose of this permit shall include incandescent lamps.

"Non-PCB Ballast" means any ballast that contains less than 50 ppm PCB.

32. Nothing in this permit shall affect the Commissioner's authority to institute any proceeding or to take any action to prevent or abate violations of law, prevent or abate pollution, recover costs and natural resource damage, and to impose penalties for violations of law.
33. Nothing in this permit shall relieve the Permittee of other obligations under applicable federal, state, and local laws.
34. This Permit to Operate shall expire five (5) years from the date of issuance and may be revoked, suspended, modified or transferred in accordance with applicable laws.
